

Rising with Pride: Achievements, Awards and Distinction of the University of Turbat



Constitution of UTQC

■ Campus Development & Landscaping

 The plantation work on campus land has been successfully completed, enhancing the campus's overall environment.

After the successful execution of Phase, I, the academic and operational facilities are in place and fully functional.

■ An Overview of Phase II of the UoT's Project

The project "Establishment of University of Turbat (Phase-II)" was approved by the Central Development Working Party (CDWP) during its meeting held from June 3-9, 2020, with a total allocated cost of Rs. 1.456 billion. The project is strategically located along the CPEC Road (M-8 Highway) in Turbat, within the Mekran Region of Balochistan.

Financial Progress

For the Financial Year 2024-25, an allocation of Rs. 300 million was made, out of which Rs. 120 million has been released as of February 11, 2025. The total funds released for the project to date amount to Rs. 815 million.



Data Center and LAN Infrastructure


To further strengthen its IT capabilities, the University of Turbat established a state-of-the-art data center and developed a comprehensive LAN infrastructure.

On February 22, 2024, the Literary Society of UoT hosted a captivating event, reflecting the university's commitment to promoting literature, the arts, and recreational activities among students.










