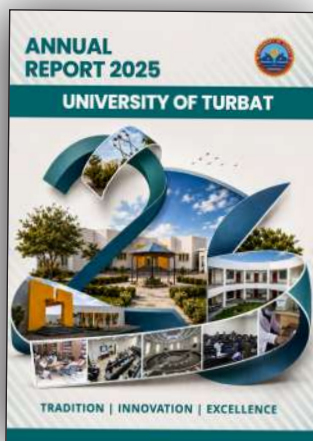

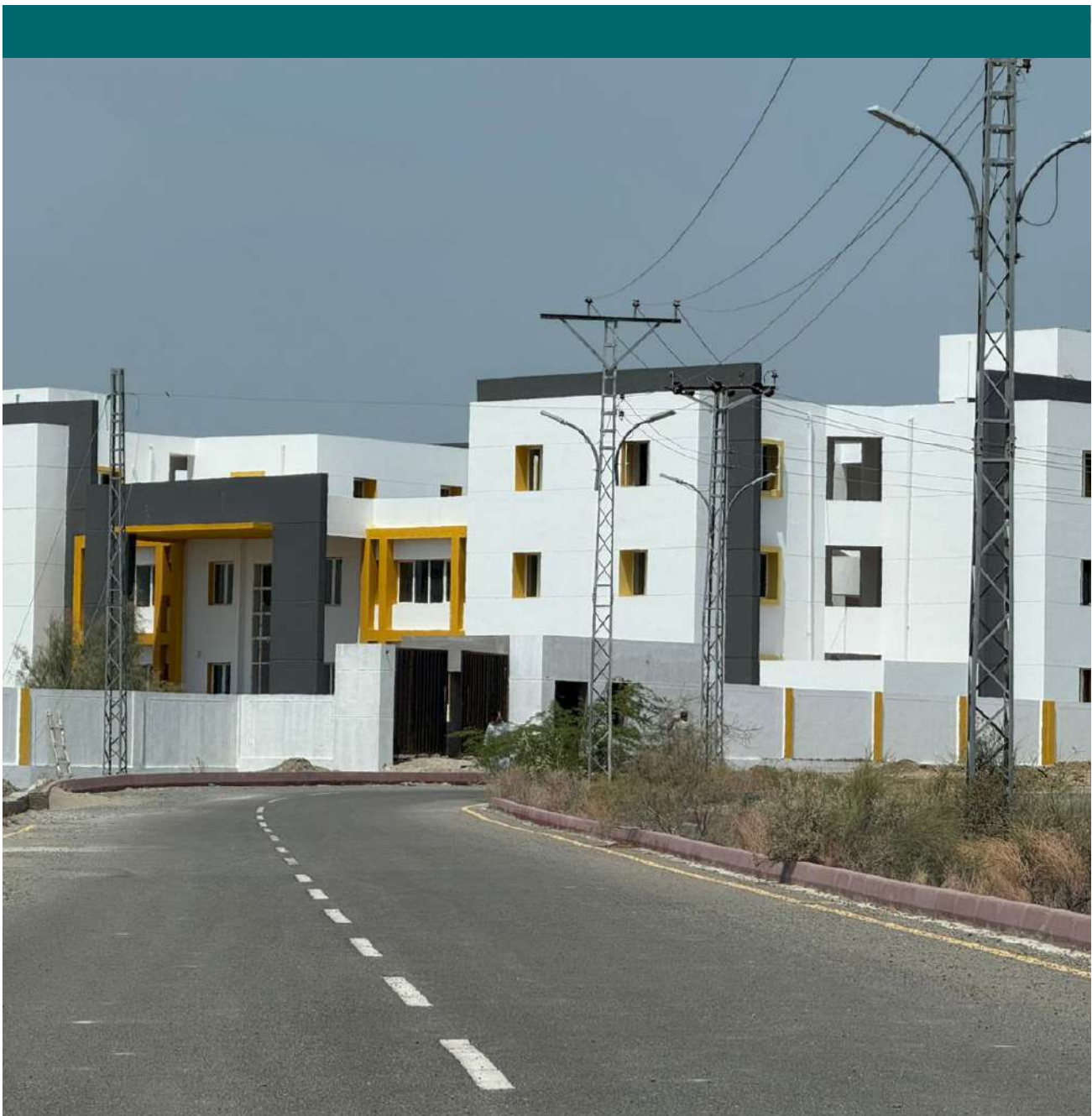


and exposure visits, study tours and internships for students across the country. Faculty members have also performed commendably at national and international levels, as detailed in this Annual Report.

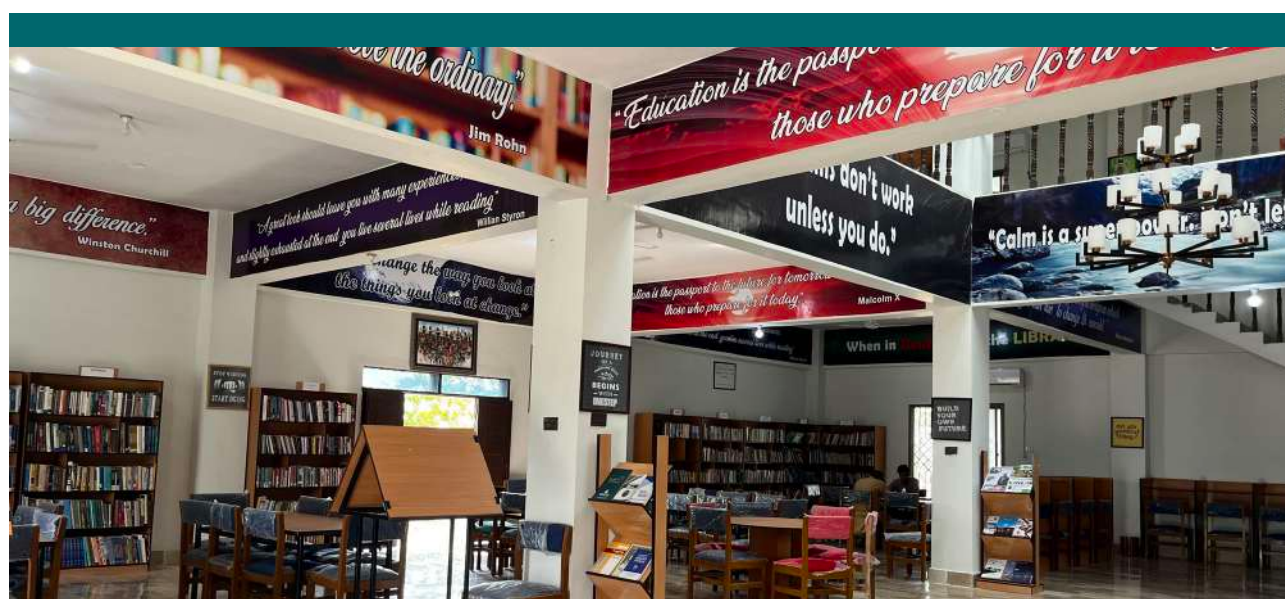

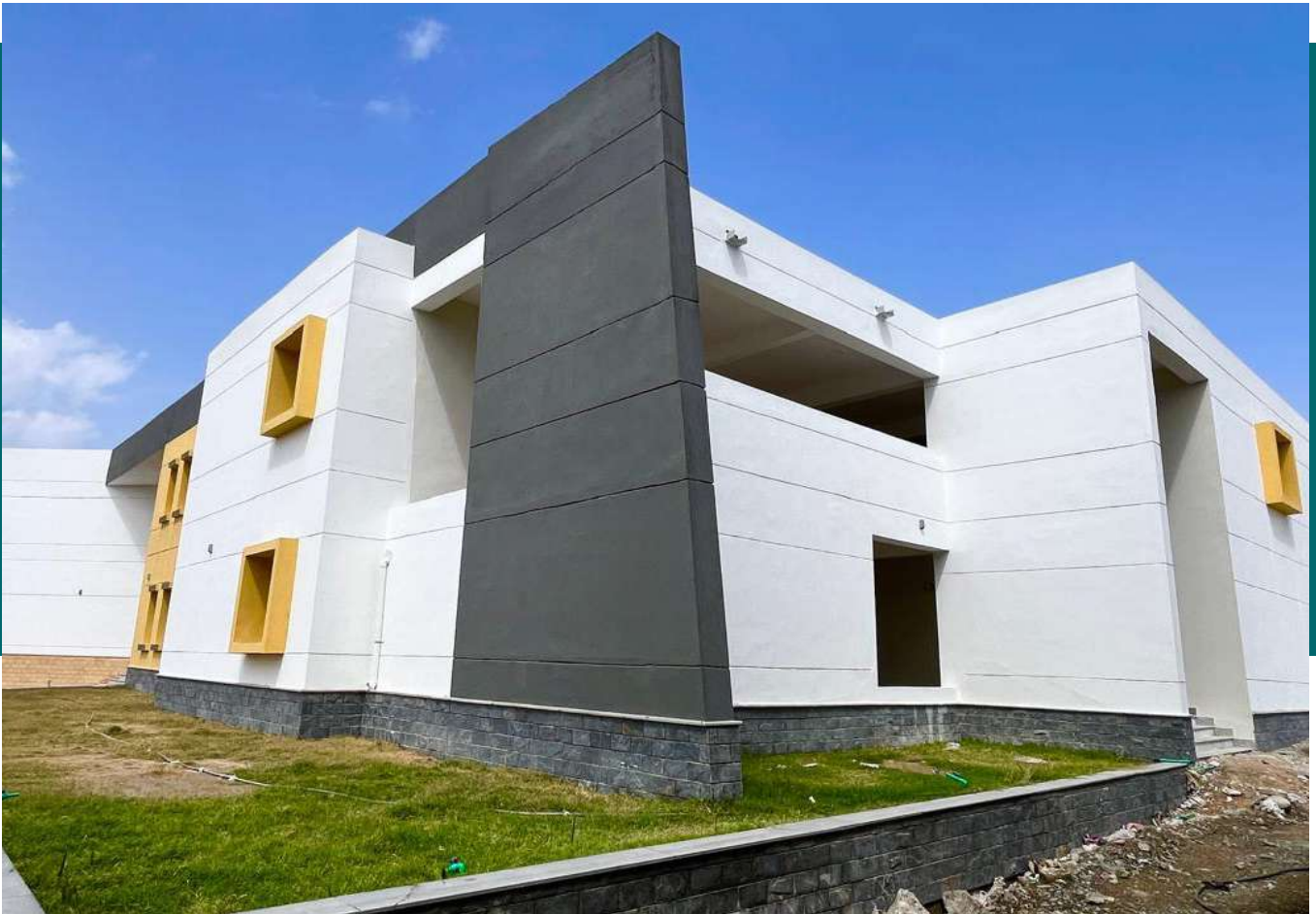

INSTITUTIONAL OVERVIEW



Institutional Overview

The University of Turbat (UoT) is the second-largest general university in Balochistan and the largest higher education institution in South Balochistan. The University plays a pivotal role in expanding access to quality higher education across the region and is entrusted with the vital responsibility of educating, training, and nurturing the youth to become skilled human capital capable of meeting the evolving social, economic, and technological demands of contemporary society.



Foundation and Establishment

The establishment of the University of Turbat (UoT) represents the fulfillment of a long-standing demand of the people of Makran Division for access to quality higher education within the region. This aspiration became a reality in May 2013 with the creation of the University of Turbat under the University of Turbat Act 2012, passed by the Government of Balochistan.

From Sub-Campus to Chartered University

Prior to attaining a full-fledged university status, the institution functioned as a sub-campus of the University of Balochistan from 2009 to 2012, operating with only three academic departments in a rented building. Within a short span, it evolved into a full-fledged public sector university and was formally recognized by the Higher Education Commission (HEC) of Pakistan in March 2014.

Offering quality education and research, nurturing the human intellect and providing a vibrant learning environment through innovation and academic excellence which make a positive impact on the society.

- Serve as liaison between the academia and the industry nationally and internationally for socio-economic development.
- Promote practices which contribute to accomplishing sustainable development goals.

Shifting Academic Activities to the Permanent Campus

Construction work on Phase I of the permanent campus commenced in 2014 and was completed within a record timeframe. Academic and administrative operations of the university were successfully moved to the purpose-built campus in 2017, providing a modern, conducive environment for teaching, learning, research, and innovation.



Phase-II Expansion and Infrastructure Modernization

The University entered a new phase of expansion with the launch of Phase II development in 2022 under the supervision of the Planning and Development Department. This phase encompasses state-of-the-art academic blocks, faculty and staff residences, student hostels, common facilities, and extensive external infrastructure development. It also includes significant technological advancements such as enhanced networking systems, campus-wide computerization and automation, modern teaching equipment, advanced laboratories, smart classrooms, a botanical garden, and a tissue culture laboratory. Construction works are in progress rapidly in accordance with approved timelines and quality standards.



Provincial Government Funded Development Projects



In addition, several development initiatives funded by the Government of Balochistan are underway, including a female faculty hostel, digital library, daycare center, basketball court for female students, youth skills development center, and a completed girls' common room to enhance inclusive and student-centered growth.

Expansion of Academic Programs and Faculty Excellence



Currently, the University comprises five faculties and twelve academic departments, along with an Institute of Balochi Language and Culture (IBLC), and a Law Faculty at the city campus. The University also established sub-campuses in Gwadar (2017) and Panjgur (2020), both of which have successfully been transformed into independent universities, demonstrating UoT's transformative role in expanding higher education across the region. Supported by a highly qualified faculty, including 41 young PhD scholars, the University of Turbat provides quality, research-oriented education to more than 4,000 students. As of Spring 2026, the University offers over 60 academic programs, including PhD, MPhil/MS/MBA, undergraduate, and professional degree programs. These programs are carefully designed to meet the evolving demands of a modern, competitive, and digital world while nurturing creativity, innovation, and entrepreneurial thinking, empowering graduates to become job creators rather than job seekers.

Digital Skills and Youth Empowerment Initiatives



Through initiatives such as free online DigiSkills training programs conducted in collaboration with partner institutions, the inclusion of technology-based courses in undergraduate programs, and the launch of professional certificate courses, the University actively equips the youth of Balochistan with essential digital competencies required in the modern era. Following its vision and mission, the University, under the leadership of Vice Chancellor Prof. Dr. Gul Hasan, continues to advance toward sustainable institutional development.

Shaping the Future of the New Generation Through Quality Education and Entrepreneurship

Today, the University of Turbat stands as a symbol of progress, opportunity, and intellectual empowerment in Balochistan. With a firm commitment to knowledge, innovation, cultural preservation, and excellence, the University continues to transform lives and contribute to regional development and national prosperity, shaping a brighter future for generations to come. The University of Turbat remains firmly committed to strengthening industry linkages, promoting innovation and entrepreneurship, and ensuring excellence across teaching, research, and administrative services. Key priorities include continuous quality enhancement initiatives, stakeholder participation in governance, expansion of national and international research collaborations, campus automation, establishment of an incubation center, implementation of environmentally sustainable initiatives, capacity-building programs, organization of national and international conferences, employee housing schemes, and revenue generation.

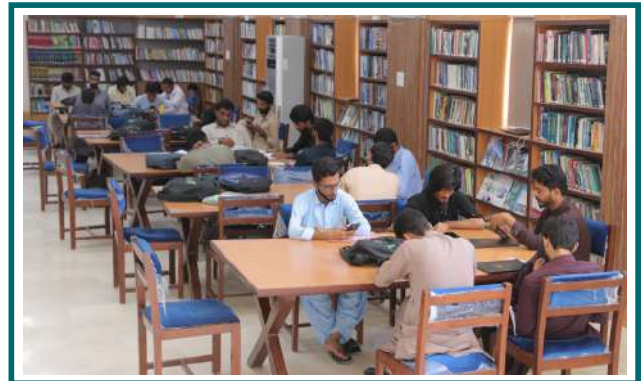

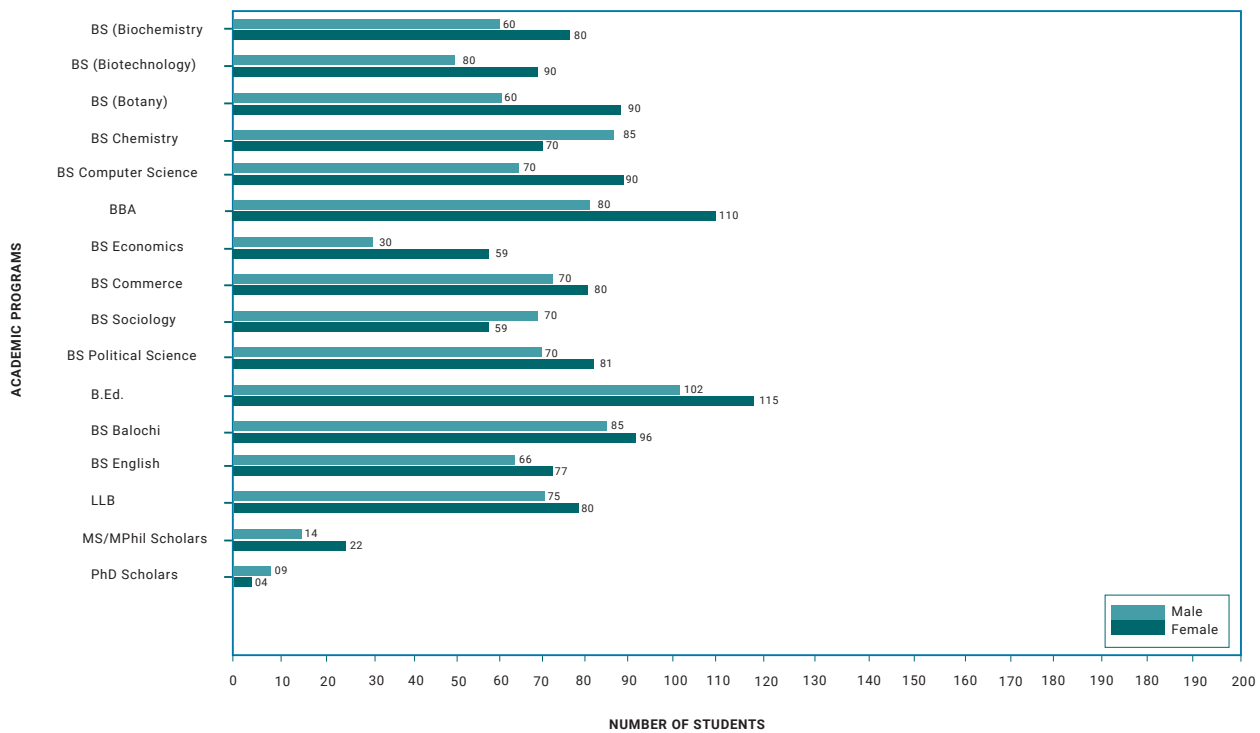

CDWP Approves Revised Project of University of Turbat (Phase-II)

The Central Development Working Party (CDWP), chaired by the Federal Minister for Planning, Development & Special Initiatives, Prof. Ahsan Iqbal, on November 14, 2025, has approved the revised PC-I of the University of Turbat

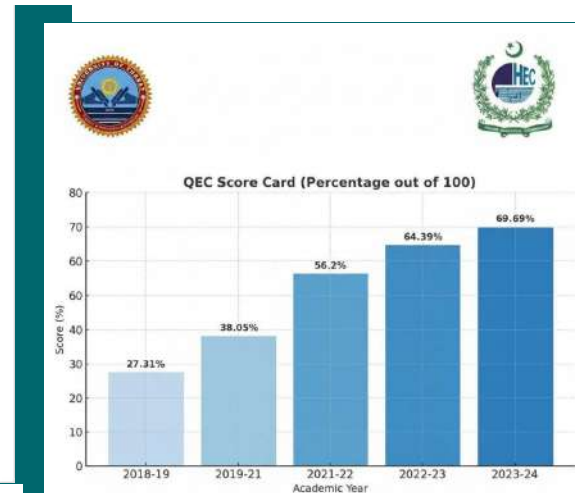
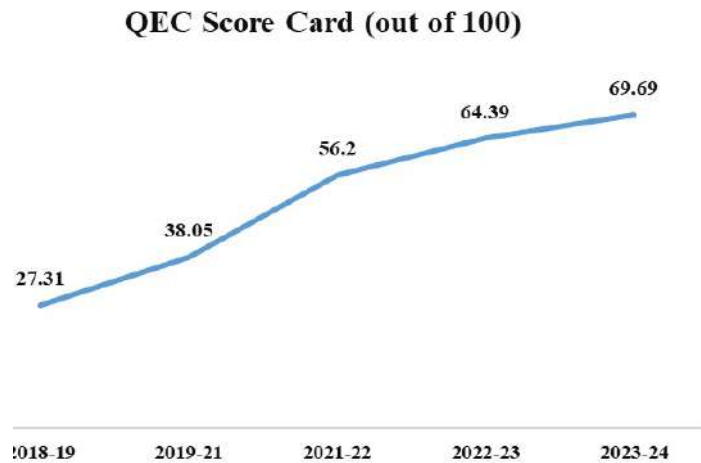
(UoT) Phase-II project at a total cost of Rs. 1,930.33 million. Prof. Ahsan Iqbal announced several targeted allocations to further strengthen student services and institutional support at UoT. These targeted allocations include Rs. 10 million for student engagement initiatives, Rs. 23 million for establishing a state-of-the-art Digital Library, Rs. 80 million for solarization of new academic blocks, and Rs. 42 million for procurement of laboratory equipment.



UoT's QEC Achieves Impressive 6-Point Increase in QEC Score

The University of Turbat's Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) has achieved a significant milestone, with its score climbing from 64 to 69.64 out of 100 in the 2023-2024 Yearly Progress Report issued by HEC. This milestone

reflects UoT's ongoing commitment to academic excellence and strong institutional governance.



UoT's Computer Science Program Earns NCEAC Accreditation; A Landmark Achievement in Quality Education



The BS Computer Science program of the University of Turbat has been accredited by the National Computing Education Accreditation Council (NCEAC), Pakistan. With this achievement, UoT stands as the only university in the region to offer an NCEAC-accredited computing program. This accreditation demonstrates the university's compliance with

NCEAC's strict benchmarks, further solidifying its position among Pakistan's leading institutions for quality computing education. This recognition elevates UoT's academic stature and reinforces its mission to provide cutting-edge, industry-aligned education to students, preparing them to tackle national and global technological challenges with confidence.



The University of Turbat emerged as joint national winners alongside FATA at the “Udaan Pakistan National Debate Championship 2025” held in Islamabad from November 24 to 28, 2025. Competing against 65 universities nationwide, UoT first secured the top position in Balochistan before sharing the overall national title with FATA.





UoT Transport Fleet Upgraded

The UoT Transport Fleet was upgraded, as the Government of Balochistan has provided three new buses to the University of Turbat (UoT). The process involves systematic evaluation of academic programs through defined criteria, including curriculum relevance, teaching-learning processes, student outcomes, and institutional support mechanisms. Relevant program teams and faculty members have been engaged in data collection, documentation, and preparation of Self-Assessment Reports (SARs).

This step reflects the University's commitment to strengthening internal quality assurance practices and enhancing the overall academic standards in line with the guidelines of the Higher Education Commission (HEC) of Pakistan.

Annual Performance Report of Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) University of Turbat

The Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) at the University of Turbat has shown consistent and remarkable progress in strengthening institutional quality assurance mechanisms in line with the standards of the Higher Education Commission (HEC), Quality Assurance Agency (QAA).

The Annual Scorecard issued by HEC-QAA reflects a significant upward trend in the performance of QEC over the years. The University achieved a score of 31 in 2018–19, which improved to 38.5 in 2019–21. This progress further accelerated with a score of 56.2 in 2021–22, followed by 64.39 in 2022–23, and 69.64 in 2023–24. Notably, the provisional score for 2024–25 has reached an impressive 83.5, demonstrating substantial advancement in quality assurance practices.

This continuous improvement is attributed to the effective implementation of Self-Assessment Reports (SARs) under the Program Review for Effectiveness and Enhancement (PREE) framework, enhanced coordination with academic departments, and strengthened internal monitoring systems. The QEC has actively engaged faculty and departmental focal persons in maintaining quality standards and ensuring timely documentation and reporting.

Moreover, the organization of capacity-building workshops, awareness sessions, and regular follow-ups has contributed to fostering a strong culture of quality within the University. Improvements in governance, stakeholder engagement, and compliance with HEC guidelines have further strengthened institutional performance.

The steady rise in QEC's score reflects the University of Turbat's firm commitment to continuous quality improvement and academic excellence. The latest provisional score highlights the success of ongoing efforts and sets a strong foundation for achieving even higher standards in the future.

The project titled “Establishment of University of Turbat (Phase-II)” was approved by the Central Development Working Party (CDWP) during its meeting held from June 3–9, 2020, at a total cost of Rs. 1.456 billion. Subsequently, the Revised PC-I of the same project was approved by the CDWP on 14th November 2025 at a revised total cost of Rs. 2,050.330 (M).

The project is strategically located along the CPEC Road (M-8 Highway) in Turbat, within the Makran Region of Balochistan.

Financial Progress

An amount of Rs. 300.000 million was allocated for the Financial Year 2025–26, against which Rs. 170.000 million has been released so far. The total cumulative release for the project so far stands at Rs. 1,164.259 million.

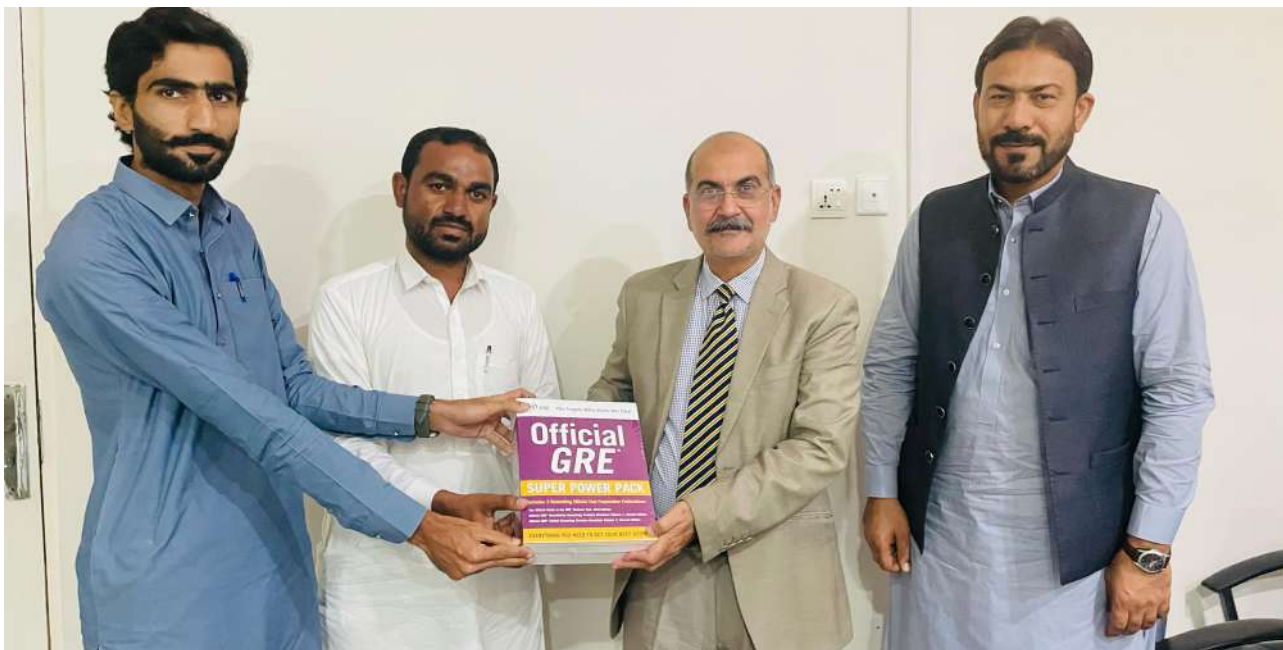
UoT Plans to Make 3rd Convocation a Landmark Event

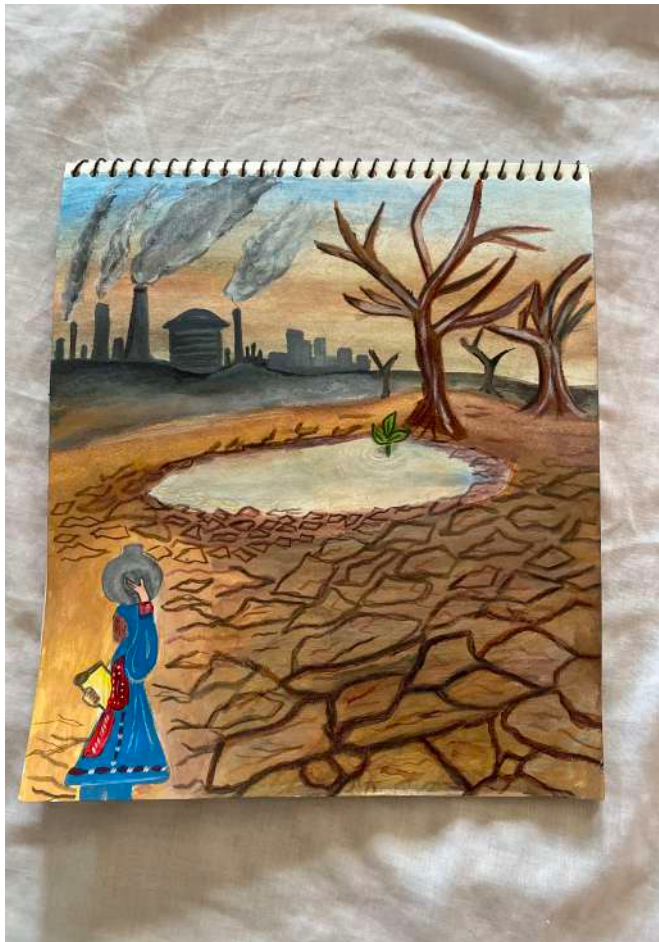
UoT Joins Global Climate Effort with Spring Plantation Drive 2025

UoT's Department of Natural and Basic Sciences, in collaboration with the Green Youth Movement, launched the Spring Plantation Drive 2025 on February 28. The event reflects UoT's commitment to environmental sustainability and the UN SDGs.



UoT Launches Tree Plantation Drive to Promote Environmental Sustainability

On July 26, 2025, the University of Turbat launched a tree plantation drive as part of its national duty to combat global warming and environmental challenges. Turbat University's Law Students Complete Internship Program Across Pakistan

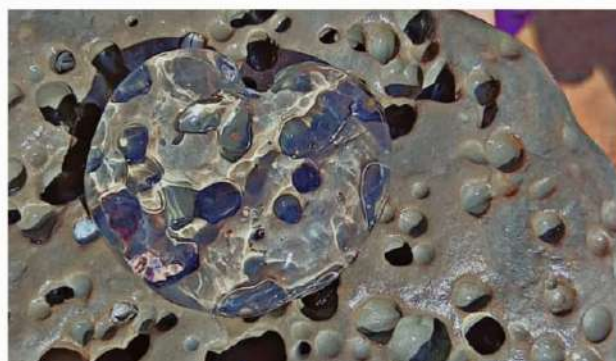
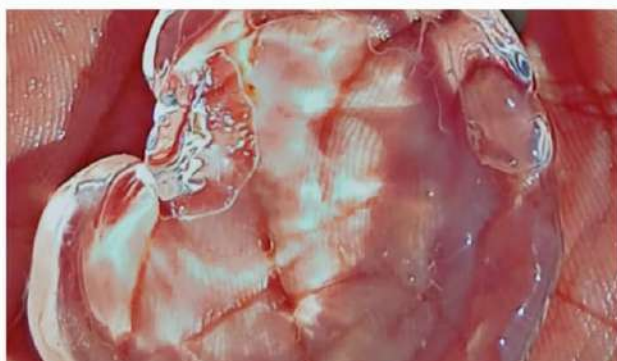
